

## A Message from Your Priest in Charge



Dear Friends,

On the 50th day after Easter we welcome Pentecost, the longest season in the Church calendar and the season that invites us to incorporate the life and teachings of Jesus and make them our own.

It's one thing to remember. And it is not enough! Notice that our memories, all of them, are focused on the past. As such, they make no difference. What makes a difference in God's world is to remember the stories about Jesus, and incorporate them into our own lives. In a nutshell, our calling is to take these memories, which by themselves are "so what" and have them be the possibility of Jesus "showing up" in our lives. To take the "so what" of history and make it "what's so" in our lives.

If you notice, our commentary of scripture is like a football commentator. "That was a good play" or "he should have thrown the ball." As such, it doesn't affect the outcome of

the game, it just gives opinion about the past.

As we listen to these wonderful stories about Jesus throughout the season of Pentecost, ask yourself "what is the invitation for me?" Commentary (even understanding) about scripture makes no difference. Seeing the invitation does! One is about the past. Invitation is about what's in front of us.

Listen to the stories about Jesus from the perspective of "what's the invitation for me?" It will produce the kingdom of Heaven! I promise you.

## April Vestry Meeting Highlights:

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Tuesday, April 24, 2018. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The actions of the Little Lamb, Shepherd's Haven and the Thrift Shoppe Management Groups were ratified. The report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit.

-The Income & Expense Report for the period ending March 31, 2018 was distributed.

-Kerrie Alvarez-Mangan reported that the Christ Church Facebook page has 233 followers. The Sunday 9:30 Church service has been live-streamed on two occasions and has been very well received. Kerrie and her husband Sebastian will be working on a new Christ Church website that should be ready by September.

-The Auditors will be here in May to conduct the 2016 audit.

-Dave Christensen has been hired as Music Minister.

-The front doors of the Church will be sanded and stained on April 26.

-Father Stephen held a Lenten Book Study that was very well attended.

-May 19 is a special Diocesan Convention where the deputies of the Newark Diocese will elect our next Bishop. Our Christ Church deputies are Deacon Barbara Harriman, Sue Helm, Janet Furness, Father Stephen and Rudy Sellitti.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 22, 2018.

## "I Like it When ..." There are Results!

The Worship and Music Committee has published a five-page report of two Town Halls held in 2017 to talk about worship and music at Christ Church. The report was emailed to everyone, and here's a snapshot of the input of about 50 participating members:

1. What did people say in response to "I Like it When...?"
2. What kind of solutions did they propose?
3. What has been done since to move in the desired direction?

Copies of the report are available in the church office, the Guild Hall, and during coffee hour. Some of the responses have been: adding a new confession to the liturgy; restoring the prelude and postlude to the 9:30 service; using a trained church organist routinely; and using the potential of the existing keyboard more fully. Christ Church welcomed a choir from another parish last summer, participated in a Community Thanksgiving Service, and now uses social media more fully. Father Stephen gears a specific portion of his sermon to the children on Family Sunday; alternate forms of the Great Thanksgiving bring variety to the Eucharist; and a Lenten book study led by Fr. Stephen allowed for greater dialogue and fellowship. Change takes time. The remaining suggestions will be addressed by various commissions of the vestry. Thanks to everyone who shared in this very positive and uplifting process!

## Tent Rental Reminder



## Book of Remembrance

You may have noticed the red book on the Prayer Desk on November 2, and when the Lay Reader read the Prayers of the People, names you haven't heard in a while were read along with the names of those in whose memory altar flowers were given, or who were recently deceased. Once a year, on All Saints' Day, or the Sunday after All Saints' Day, names added to the Book of Remembrance over the past 5 years or so are read.

If you would like a loved one's name inscribed in the Book of Remembrance, which normally resides in the case on the wall to the right of the Baptismal Font, please see Erica Stewart or any one of the Altar Guild members. The person's name, as you would like it to appear (for example, with or without a middle initial or name, etc.), and their birth and death year, will be inscribed in the book and read aloud next year during the Prayers of the People on All Saints' Day. A \$5.00 donation to the Altar Guild is requested.



## News from the Sunday School

In March, due to the Easter holidays, Family Sunday was celebrated early, on March 18th. It was a joyous Family Sunday with great participation and the singing was wonderfully led by Samantha Hanania.

After the 9:30 service on March 18th, we had many activities related to our Fundraiser for Seeing Eye Dogs/Service Animals. For one, the dogs came for a visit. They did bring along their trainers. We arranged for a visit from the Foster Parents for the Seeing Eye Foundation, who came with a variety of dogs of different breeds and ages. They explained how they train the dogs for approximately 18 months, getting them prepared to be placed with a blind or seeing impaired person. But then they have to return their dogs so they can become service animals, which is truly an amazing sacrifice. It was a great visit and the children and adults were fascinated.

During the visit, the Sunday School had a snack sale and sold delicious baked goods along with chocolate covered strawberries and fresh fruit. We raised a few hundred dol-

lars for the cause! Be sure to look for the dog house and doggie made by the talented Helm family and drop in a few dollars when you can. Karen Simone also had a successful Easter candy sale for this cause which ended on Palm Sunday.

On Easter Sunday, the children again attended the Family Service and there were some new faces in attendance. Many were brave and willing to sing with the Cherub choir, which was delightful to see! We hope your families all enjoyed a wonderful Easter season.

We are beginning our Early Communion classes and Early Communion will be celebrated in May. We look forward to this wonderful event.
