


A Message from Your Priest in Charge

Vestry Meeting Highlights

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Tuesday, September 20, 2016. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved and the report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit. The actions of the Little Lamb Management Group, the actions of the Shepherd's Haven Management Group, and the actions of the Thrift Shoppe Management Group were ratified.

Treasurer Joe Blauvelt and Father Stephen met with a representative from Fidelity to discuss our investment account and how to best manage it. A motion was passed, upon a recommendation from the Finance Committee, that each organization of Christ Church be responsible for expenses directly related to their own operations.

Shepherd's Haven is not having a fundraiser this year. Instead they will have an open house on Saturday, October 22.

Little Lamb had a new fence installed. Their 25th anniversary celebration was a success.

The Youth Sunday service will be changed to Family Sunday. It will be held on the last Sunday of each month and include updated prayers and music.

Name tags are being prepared for all parishioners to wear at Sunday services. They will be ready this fall.

The Parish Hall needs to be updated. The curtains are old and stained. We will get proposal on everything, including painting the back wall. Then it will be decided what will be done.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 18, 2016.

We sunday School year. We want to start with a quick recap of last year. We want to express congratulations to the three children who made Early Communion on May 22nd 2016! They were Alizah Morran, Christian Longo, and Sabrina Tripaldi. These classes were taught by Kathy Shepherd with a workshop by Father Stephen.

Last year, the Sunday School fundraiser was dedicated to the Cystic Fibrosis (CF) Foundation. We held a variety of different events over the year to raise money for the CF Foundation and also were visited several times by members of the Foundation. By the end of last year, the final fundraising for Cystic Fibrosis through the Sunday School and other Christ Church outreach programs came to a total of \$6,158.76.

Kirstin Dunn (who has CF) and her husband came on Flyup Sunday to join our presentation. They met with many of us during coffee hour and expressed their gratitude for our willingness to help raise money for a disease we did not have. It was an honor and a pleasure to have met them.

The Sunday School students also kicked off the annual Food Drive for St. Mary's during the Spring months. The food drive slogan for 2016 was Operation: End Hunger and each week the Sunday School requested nonperishable donations focused on a different theme (e.g. breakfast, lunch, dinner, paper, favorites). On June 5th, the Sunday School children and adults delivered over 50 bags of food to St. Mary's (in the rain!). Luckily the newspaper came and took our picture which was in the Trends Newspaper the following week.
