

A Message from Your Priest in Charge



Dear Friends,

Ellen Ewing sent me a fascinating article recently about the relationship between generosity and happiness. The article stated "a neurological study published in Nature Communications showed that generosity changed the activity in people's brains in ways that increase feelings of happiness, even if the generous act is small or only imagined." Wow! The study was conducted at the University of Zurich where 50 students participated in the project, each given \$25 every week for a month. Half of the students were given the instructions to spend the money on themselves. The other half instructed to give it away to a different person each week. So, half the volunteers agreed to be

selfish, the other half generous.

There was a noticeable difference in the disposition of the students when the project was completed. Those who agreed to give money away reported feeling "significantly happier" than those who spent the money on themselves.

While we think of generosity as usually related to money, what about being generous with our "being" especially as it shows up in our conversation, the words that come out of our mouths?

Most of the conversations I hear are about judging, blaming, holding onto my opinion as better than yours, etc. This isn't generosity. It's selfish, petty and judgmental. To be generous with our mouths is to let go of being right, looking good, what's in it for me?

As children of God, we are invited to be "born again," that is to say, to reinvent ourselves in such a way that we're directed and committed to the Spirit of God. Reinvent yourself as a generous human being and first and foremost have generosity be a product of your mouth!

September Vestry Meeting Highlights

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Tuesday, September 19, 2017. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The actions of the Thrift Shoppe Management Group and the actions of the Little Lamb Management Group were ratified. The report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit.

- The Income & Expense Report for the period ending August 31, 2017 was distributed.

- We are getting estimates from landscapers to clean up the grounds, weed, trim bushes, etc.

- Accurate Pest Control will come and set traps for the squirrels to catch and relocate them.

- There are many lights out around the Church including in the offices and the Parish Hall. In some places the fixtures will be replaced with more efficient units.

- A motion was passed to purchase an additional wall plaque for the Memorial Garden to hold the name plates. The total cost, delivered and installed is \$11,596.00.

- A motion was passed to set aside money to replace the roof over 420 Ramapo Avenue.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 17, 2017.

Book of Remembrance

You may have noticed the red book on the Prayer Desk on November 2, and when the Lay Reader read the Prayers of the People, names you haven't heard in a while were read along with the names of those in whose memory altar flowers were given, or who were recently deceased. 
Pledge Card Reminder
